Improving uptake of bowel cancer screening amongst Australian men: A national randomized controlled trial

Professor Deborah Turnbull
University of Adelaide

Abstract: This talk will address the behavioural aspects of cancer control, which Professor Turnbull has been researching since the late 1980s. Her most recent research, which she will discuss here, investigates practical and scalable methods to improve uptake for bowel cancer screening. This NHMRC funded work has been influential in informing the design of the invitation process for the national screening program.

Abstract: Professor Turnbull has just finished her second term as a member of the Competitive Grants Review Committee of the NSW Cancer Institute and has served as the Chair of the Research Advisory Board of the Australian Primary Health Care Research Institute. She is a regular reviewer for the Canadian Institutes of Health. She is also a committed teacher and contributes across the psychology curriculum in the areas of research methods, health psychology, and cross-cultural psychology.
