We are pleased to announce that the Journal of Public Economic Theory (JPET) and the Journal of Mathematical Economics (JME) are planning a special workshop, to be held from March 13th to March 15th, 2020, hosted by New York University Abu Dhabi (NYUAD). The title and focus of the Workshop is:

Markets, Policies and Economic Design: Theory and Experiments

Submissions to the workshop and for publication will be opened on October 15th, with a deadline of January 30th 2020. Authors of selected papers will be invited to participate in the workshop. Local expenses will be covered by the conferences. A number of special events are planned. A registration fee may be charged to cover special events.
