What's this project about?

The Mental Health and Wellbeing Directorate of Wellbeing SA is seeking **international students** who are interested in **designing and/or participating in a video interview to talk with Mental Health Commissioner David Kelly about how COVID-19 has impacted on their emotional/mental health and wellbeing.**

We will be talking about topics like:

- How COVID-19 has impacted/is impacting on your day to day life (e.g. study, relationships with others etc.) and
- How you have overcome any challenges presented by COVID-19 (e.g. restrictions, lockdown, job losses etc.)

What happens when?
